Comments from the Chair



Chris Neggers (forester with The Nature Conservancy) told me that in the North Carolina SAF chapter that once you were chair you were immune from ever having to do it again. He explained how they were especially good at recruiting (unsuspecting) people to be chair. Of course neither of these fit me. I wanted to do it again because of the many important, exciting things ISAF is doing behind the scenes. There is the financial support ISAF provides for educational outreach videos and shows to educate those already interested in forest management, and to provide alternative, accurate information regarding forest issues in Indiana. Also there is the hard work getting us to FFA (we are at the start of a three year reprieve while they are in Louisville) and HASTI conventions to reach our future. There is the work ISAF does in partnership with other conservation groups to help keep state legislators informed on important natural resource issues in Indiana. There is ISAF providing financial support to young forestry students to attend the national SAF convention. These are a few of the flashier things

that happen among the many less glorified things that ISAF members do day in and day out (keep financial records/funds, take minutes, track membership, track investments, create newsletters, approve continuing education, plan continuing education, plan fundraising, manage website, ...) that provide a voice in management of Indiana's natural resources, and also provide a service to the members.

I think it is the perspective that comes with age (experience would be nicer to say, but it really is an age thing) that I now see the opportunities to influence future generations, whether forestry students at Purdue, young students in K through 12, and young foresters in the first years of their career as being the most important thing we do. Experience/age has taught me that things can and do change over time. When I started working for state forests there was a metes and bounds inholding that was a real pain because the described corners were often missing. This inholding was an old field stream bottom that was being invaded by knee to chest high yellow-poplar. Also, the entrance road of the main recreation area had an attractive, mature planting of eastern white pine. It was a really nice entryway for recreational users.

But these have changed through the years. We finally had a chance to close out that old field inholding with a purchase. On visiting the site I was greeted with yellow-poplar that was 35+ feet tall where I once was able to look out across the valley over them. On the other hand that nice white pine is about gone, with the storms in November that spawned the tornadoes taking out a large number of the remaining pine. Something else will now replace it.

I used to put more weight on the close horizon things—the camaraderie and short term fundraising of selling Christmas trees for example. But now the many things I see ISAF doing are things that are going to have long term, important impacts are the ones I find most exciting and satisfying. For me it was a good reason to come back around to be chair again.

Old Business:

1. HASTI Update from John Friedrich and Donna Rogler
 - a. Attendance was down but good experience
2. History/ Archive Chair
 - a. John Friedrich has volunteered
 - b. Digitizing the archive to make it searchable with the help of Ball State was discussed and approved

New Business:

1. Letter from SAF student chapter at Purdue received and passed around
2. Indiana Forestry Education Foundation
 - a. IFEF request INSAF to donate items to auction
 - b. Brian Gandy makes motion to allow Jayson Waterman to purchase wooden items for up to \$500.
 - c. Motion amended to \$250, seconded by Dale , passed by voice vote
3. Proceeds from winter meeting, \$33, given to Scott Reckelhoff
4. Donna Rogler brings several funding proposals to the group
 - a. State Forester would like multiyear commitment to assist funding “Indiana Forestry Film” project.
 - i. Various amounts and time lines are discussed
 - ii. After discussion of amounts and Jayson motions to fund at the level of \$10,000 over 3 years, seconded by Lenny and passed on voice vote
